CAMC Institute for Academic Medicine

The CAMC Institute for Academic Medicine provides education, outreach and research support to student physicians and other medical professionals. The institute operates 20 graduate medical education, three pharmacy residency programs and two clinical psychology internships. As a major academic medical center, CAMC supports:

- Over 1,000 learners in CAMC's facilities on any given day
- 247 interns, residents and fellows
- 74 West Virginia University School of Medicine medical students
- 108 West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine students
- 87 students enrolled in the CAMC School of Anesthesia (affiliated with Marshall University)
- Clinical education experiences to more than 1,300 learners through 122 educational affiliated programs with WV and regional colleges and universities
- 34% of graduates establish practice/continue training in West Virginia (10-year average)
- 1,268 continuing education programs with 35,521 hours of credit issued

CAMC Foundation

In 2024, the foundation provided more than \$7 million in grants to support patients, families, CAMC employees, and programs and services provided at CAMC.

Vandalia Health

In September 2022, Charleston Area Medical Center and

Mon Health System created Vandalia Health, a multi-state health system with locations across West Virginia as well as in Maryland, Pennsylvania and Virginia. In December 2023, Davis Health System joined Vandalia Health. It is made up of 17 hospitals (14 plus 3 affiliates), over 190 outpatient locations, more than 13,000 employees and more than 2,000 doctors and advanced practice providers.
